

ORDINANCE NO. 52

ORDER OF THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE GOLETA SANITARY DISTRICT ADOPTING AN ORDINANCE AND GENERAL REGULATION PROVIDING FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF LOCAL LIMITS FOR WASTEWATER DISCHARGE IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE DISTRICT'S SEWER USE ORDINANCE NO. 44, AND REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 48.

The Governing Board of the Goleta Sanitary District (the "District") does hereby adopt the following Ordinance and General Regulation:

ARTICLE I

As of the effective date hereof, Ordinance No. 48 is repealed in its entirety and is replaced by this Ordinance No. 52.

ARTICLE II

The following are the maximum concentrations of pollutants allowable in wastewater discharges to the Goleta Sanitary District wastewater collection and treatment system by any user. Dilution of any wastewater discharge for the purpose of satisfying these requirements shall be considered a violation of this Ordinance. Any violation of this Ordinance is subject to the terms and conditions as set forth in the District's Sewer Use Ordinance No. 44, as said Ordinance No. 44 may be amended from time to time.

ARTICLE III

The District's Manager may revise the foregoing concentration limitations to address special circumstances relating to a specific discharger. Such revision shall become effective as to said specific discharger upon approval by the District's Governing Board.

ARTICLE IV

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional, ineffective, or in any manner in conflict with the laws of the United States, or the State of California, such a decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of the Ordinance. The Governing Board of the District hereby declares that it would have passed this Ordinance and each section, subsection, sentence, clause and phrase thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase be declared unconstitutional, ineffective, or in any manner in conflict with the laws of the United States of the State of California.

ARTICLE V

The Secretary of the District is hereby directed to cause this Ordinance to be published once in the Santa Barbara News Press, a newspaper of general circulation in the District. pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 6490.


